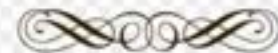

ARE WE IN THE “DECADE OF THE FEMALE LAWYER”?

In 2024, the American Bar Association highlighted a series of milestones reflecting a shift in the legal profession from a male majority to a female majority:

- In 2016, women became a majority of law school students.
- In 2020, women became a majority of general lawyers in the federal government.
- In 2023, women became a majority of law firm associates.
- By 2024 or 2025, women were projected to become a majority of full-time law school faculty.

These are meaningful benchmarks, and for many of us who have been practicing for decades, the change is striking. I graduated from law school in 1998, when women made up roughly 35% of new graduates. At that time, it was not unusual to see only a handful of women attorneys in a crowded courtroom. Today, that is no longer the case.

Locally, the shift is just as visible. While historical data is limited, there were likely only one or two women serving on the bench in Burlington County in the late 1990s. As of 2026, there are seven. Experiences will vary by practice area, but it is fair to say that women are no longer outliers in most legal settings.

With increased representation should come increased opportunity: leadership roles, equitable compensation, and a stronger presence in shaping the profession. It has also opened the door to broader conversations about what a successful legal career looks like. The traditional model—long hours, rigid advancement tracks, and a single definition of success—does not reflect the realities or priorities of many attorneys today.

At the same time, the data tells a more complicated story.

Women hold only 28% of equity partnership positions in law firms. They remain underrepresented in senior leadership roles, including on the bench and in in-house counsel positions. And being in the majority doesn't mean women are earning the majority of the positions. [1] And being in the majority doesn't mean women are earning the majority of the money. Far from it. Women attorneys still face significant pay gaps; in 2024 the average pay for male partners was 29% higher than that of female partners. [2]

Many of us also hear a similar theme in conversations with colleagues: while representation has improved, advancement and workplace culture have not always kept pace. There is a sense, in some quarters, that progress has

slowed, and that some of the momentum around equity and inclusion is less certain than it was a few years ago.

So what does this mean for the Burlington County Bar?

First, it is worth recognizing the progress that has been made. Increased representation has strengthened the profession and broadened perspectives in meaningful ways. At the same time, representation alone is not the endpoint.

Bar associations are uniquely positioned to support the next phase of progress. Mentorship programs, leadership development opportunities, and intentional efforts to promote diverse candidates for committees, panels, and judicial appointments all play a role. Equally important are the day-to-day professional practices—how work is assigned, how contributions are recognized, and how career paths are supported within our own offices and organizations.

If this is, in fact, the “Decade of the Female Lawyer,” it will not be defined solely by numbers. It will be defined by whether the profession continues to evolve in ways that translate representation into meaningful opportunity and long-term equity.

There is real progress to acknowledge—and real work still ahead.

May Wine Pick of the Month

On a recent Sunday, I visited the White Horse Winery in Hammonton, NJ. I've had their wine twice before, but it had been a couple of years, and I wanted to see how the wines were coming along. The tasting room has a front porch and a back deck, which would be lovely on a warm, sunny day, but given the cool, rainy weather, everyone was inside. There is a giant bar in the center of the room, with tables surrounding it, and food available from their kitchen. A man with a long gray beard was playing guitar and singing soft rock songs. People were eating food (I saw French fries and cheese).

Their wine tasting flight is five 2-ounce pours for \$14, which is a good deal. All of their wines are from the Outer Coastal Plain AVA; no grapes imported from the West Coast here.

I started with their 2025 Albariño. The wine is pale yellow in color, with notes of lemon and white flowers on the nose, with the citrus continuing on the palate. The wine had bright acidity and was well-balanced and refreshing. The label on the back recommends pairing it with seafood, poultry, salads, and happy hours. 13.5% ABV; \$26.30 a bottle. I ended up buying a bottle of Albariño.



Next, I tried their 2024 Chardonnay (regular, not Barrel Fermented). Light gold in color, with tropical notes (coconut and pineapple) and some green apple, their version of Chardonnay was lacking in acidity and seemed a little flabby to me. 13.5% ABV. This wine came with a screw top, and is their cheapest, at \$19.50. Next time, I'll try the barrel fermented version.

On to the reds. I next tasted their 2021 Chambourcin. Chambourcin is a French-America hybrid grape bred for cold-hardiness and disease resistance, that grows well in NJ. Ruby in color, with blueberry, pomegranate, and cranberry notes on the nose, continuing on the palate, and joined by baking spices. This is a great Thanksgiving Day wine. This is bottled in a pinot noir/Burgundy bottle, perhaps due to the medium body and lighter tannins. 12.2% ABV; \$20.50 a bottle. I took a bottle of Chambourcin home also.

Next up was the Estate Reserve Cabernet Franc. This wine is made from 100% estate-grown grapes (not bought from other growers in the Outer Coastal Plain AVA). Garnet in color, with dark red fruit aromas, plum, sour cherry, white pepper, and oak on the nose, and dark red fruit and sour cherry continuing on the palate. Only 12.5% ABV; \$42.50 a bottle.

Finally, I tasted their version of Coeur d'Est (several wineries in the Outer Coastal Plain make a Coeur d'Est to showcase NJ grapes). Their version contained a blend of Chambourcin, Syrah, and Cabernet Franc, and was aged in French and American Oak. The bottle was newly opened, and could have used a few hours of decanting to smooth out the tight tannins, but it developed well in the glass. 12.3% ABV; \$38.50 a bottle



I definitely recommend a trip to White Horse Winery. Their winemaking team, comprised of viticulturist Edward Sparks, from Bordeaux, France and winemaker Seferino Cotzoy, of Guatemala, is doing great things with NJ grapes. Their label art, featuring a white horse against a starry sky, was created by Jamie Wyeth, the third generation of Wyeth family painters, from Chadds Ford.

When the Legal Question Is Really a Life Question

Families often begin searching for legal help for aging parents when something has already gone wrong: a fall, a diagnosis, a hospital stay that turns into a discharge plan no one feels ready for. In elder care law, the legal issue is rarely the whole story. More often, it is the first signal that a much larger life transition is underway. The life transition affects not just finances or documents, but relationships, caregiving capacity, and the future itself.

My path into elder care law was shaped by an interdisciplinary education that taught me to see legal problems in their social and human context. I

studied sociology at The George Washington University, earned my law degree from The Catholic University of America, and later completed a master's in social work with a concentration in aging at the University of Pennsylvania. That training continues to inform me on how I advocate today.

This work is personal and it shaped how I understand the cost of not planning. My father died without an estate plan, and I saw firsthand how uncertainty compounds grief and stress for the people left behind. I also had a grandmother who required long-term care for seven years. Watching my family navigate care decisions over time often without clear guidance reinforced for me that planning is not just about documents. It is about protecting people during the most vulnerable chapters of their lives. Unanswered legal questions do not stay legal for long. They become emotional, financial, and relational crises.

A life care planning law firm is, at its core, an elder care law firm but it goes far beyond what most people think of as traditional legal services. At Rothkoff Law Group, families receive legal representation and advocacy related to Medicaid and Veterans' benefits, asset protection, special needs planning, guardianship, and estate administration.

Additionally, we work with families over time. We help them navigate hospitals, rehabilitation centers, nursing homes, assisted living, independent living communities, home care, and hospice. We also step in during sudden health crises, when families are overwhelmed and unsure where to turn. In those moments, families do not just need legal answers, they need orientation. They need someone who can take a blur of information and turn it into a sequence: what needs attention now, what can wait, what the next chapter is likely to look like, and how to make decisions that align with the client's goals. They need a plan that accounts for both the legal and human realities of what's happening.

When the Legal Question Is Really a Life Question

Most people come to Rothkoff Law Group after a fall, a diagnosis, or a hospitalization that turns into a rehabilitation stay when it becomes clear that the current arrangement is no longer sustainable. They are often exhausted, making high stakes decisions under time pressure while navigating unfamiliar systems.

I work with people like Judy, a visually impaired older adult who was scammed out of \$14,000 by a "senior planning" company promising assistance with Medicaid when she was not financially eligible for Medicaid. I also work with people like Warren, who can no longer manage his wife's dementia care needs on his own, helping him secure respite care, protect assets, and build a supportive team while finding the best possible care for his wife.

Together, these stories reflect the same reality: when planning ignores timing, caregiving limits, and human vulnerability, the consequences are real and lasting.

I serve as a resource guiding people toward what does exist, being honest about what does not, and continuing the work of improving the lives of older adults and individuals living with disabilities. Rothkoff Law Group is a team of advocates attorneys, geriatric social workers, and public benefits specialists working together every day to educate, solve problems, and find solutions.

One of the defining aspects of Rothkoff Law Group's approach is its commitment to education. Clear, accurate information is not treated as a marketing tool, it is central to the firm's mission. When families understand what a path forward truly requires logistically, financially, and emotionally, they can stop guessing. They can plan.

Coming from an advocacy background, I do not view education as "nice." I view it as protective. It protects clients from rushed decisions they later regret. It protects caregivers from burnout. It protects families from miscommunication that turns into conflict. And it challenges the belief that documents alone can solve complex care issues. Information, used well, is one of the most effective forms of protection we can offer.

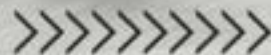

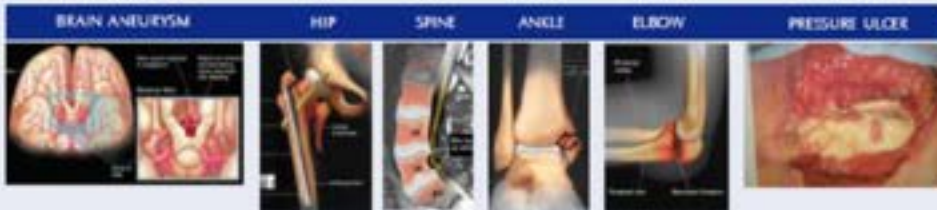
