



## Wine Column

In October, we went to Umbria, Italy to visit a friend who has retired there, in a small town called Penna in Teverina, about a 30-minute high speed train ride north of Rome. While we were in Italy, the olive harvest was going on. We had olive oil made the same day the olives had been harvested from the trees and pressed. Delicious and so green!

In addition to the olive trees everywhere, there were also vineyards, of course! The closest winery to Penna is in the neighboring town of Giove (meaning Jupiter). Azienda Agricola Le Crete has about 6 hectares of vineyards, lying in a microclimate of the Tiber Valley,



and producing about 50,000 bottles per year. They cultivate local varietals, such as Sangiovese and Trebbiano, as well as international varietals such as Merlot and Sauvignon Blanc, so their wines are all IGT rather than DOC. We stopped by on a Monday morning, and interrupted the owner and winemaker, Giuliano Castellani, for a tasting, while he was pressing grapes from this year's harvest.



After a short tour of the "factory," Giuliano poured us a glass of his rosé wine directly from a stainless- steel tank. If you've ever had "new wine" that isn't done fermenting, you know how alive with natural carbonation it is while the yeast is working away. The rosé tasted like strawberry-lemon soda now, but in a few weeks, I'm sure it will be a perfect summer rosé. We next stopped in the barrel room, before ascending stairs to the tasting room.

We sat in the tasting room's courtyard, enjoying the sunny fall day, and several other bottles he opened for us. The first was his sparkling wine, an Extra Dry Vino Spumante Millesimato. This was his version of a blanc de noir, being Sangiovese grapes made into a white wine. We enjoyed full glasses of the delightful sparkling wine, while he assisted other customers. 12% ABV; €9.50.

The second bottle he opened was their most popular white table wine, Cima del Giglio Linea Oro IGT, a blend of Sauvignon Blanc and Malvasia. The wine opened with notes of citrus and herbs on the nose, and flavors of peach and apricot on the palate, with stony minerality on the finish. We drank several bottles of this wine throughout the week, which paired so well with the lemony pasta our host prepared for us. 14% ABV; €12.50.

The third bottle he opened was their most popular red table wine, Petranera Linea ORO IGT Umbria Rosso, a blend of Sangiovese, Merlot, Montepulciano and Barbera. On the nose, notes of black cherry and plum. On the palate, flavors of black fruits with a full-bodied, smooth mouthfeel and long finish. This wine pairs well with the wild boar and venison of the area, as well as red sauces. 14.5% ABV; €12.50.

The bottles are a little tall for my wine suitcase, but I managed. If you are ever in southern Umbria, I highly recommend a stop at Le Crete! Saluti!


England is not only one of our closest global allies, but British culture is also very appealing. Think of all the great British rock music (Beatles, Stones, and many others), beef wellington, and that whole monarchy thing . . . - 5. <u>YourZelle</u> Animated production starring the pretty faced Zelle, who owns an online financial service company that charges exorbitantly high rates. But Zelle gets to continue to take advantage of her customers by sweetly singing to them "Let Your Money Go!"
- 6. <u>"Cedric, I'm Your Father"</u> Science fiction film of intergalactic battles using lots of special effects. Our hero Cedric is constantly fighting his arch enemy. The only problem with this movie is that the studio selected a title which gives the entire premise of the plot away.
- 7. <u>The Under Achievers</u> Well-meaning superheroes combine power and efforts, but are unable to save London Bridge from falling down.
- 8. <u>Lord of the Subways</u> Quirky funny looking characters team up for a big underground adventure, but spend most of the movie trying to figure out how to exit the complicated London subway system.



## Preparing for Personal Injury Mediation by: Timothy M. O'Donnell, Esq.



When dealing with a high value personal injury case, private mediation can be a great tool for resolution when the parties and their attorneys cannot settle the matter themselves. A need for mediation does not mean that you aren't doing a good job handling the matter. Sometimes a party or multiple parties just need the assistance of an independent person to understand the true value of a case, taking into account the risks of going forward with trial. Before mediation can take place, you will need to make sure you and your client are fully prepared for the mediation session.

Make sure all the relevant parties to a case are willing to engage in mediation. Although this usually means getting all parties to the litigation onboard for the mediation process, this is not always the case. For example, in a litigation with more than one defendant, if one defendant takes a "no pay" position and does not want to mediate, but the other parties agree amongst themselves that the "no pay" party is unlikely to be apportioned any liability at trial, mediation can usually proceed without the "no pay" party's participation.

The parties need to agree on who the mediator should be. Factors which should go into your calculation for an appropriate mediator include the mediator's experience with the specific area personal injury involved (slip and fall, commercial auto, construction accident, etc.), the mediator's experience in the venue where the case is pending, and the reputation the mediator has in the legal community. You always want to be able to assure your client that the mediator is fair-minded without favoring plaintiffs or defendants and that the mediator will do the work necessary to fully understand all of the issues at play prior to the day of the mediation. If you are not familiar with a mediator suggested by another party, ask around to see what other attorneys think of that mediator and what experiences they have had with them.

The parties need to agree on when the mediation should take place. If the Plaintiff is still receiving medical treatment and may undergo a surgery in the near future that will impact the value of the claim, you may need to wait until that treatment is completed before you are ready for mediation. If you believe there is still a deposition that needs to take place or an expert report that needs to be obtained that is going to impact the value of the claim or the apportionment of liability, make sure that additional discovery is completed before the mediation and that you have the opportunity to discuss with your client the impact that discovery has on the claims at issue.

## Preparing for Personal Injury Mediation by: Timothy M. O'Donnell, Esq. (Cont'd)

Make sure you have the claims properly valued. This means assessing all damages plaintiff is claiming, assessing the likelihood of success on all defenses which are being asserted against those claims, and the likely apportionment of liability to each party. If there are outstanding medical bills or a lost wage claim, make sure you know the full value of those claims and that you have shared all relevant documents and information with opposing counsel related to supporting or defending against those claims. You want to make sure you give the opposing parties all the tools they need to properly value the claim as well to minimalize any surprises during the mediation session. Once you have valued the claim in full, make sure your client agrees with your valuation and both of you are on the same page. Proper valuation of the claim is also important to explain your position to the mediator and give the mediator the tools they need to opine on the value of the claims and present those arguments to opposing parties.

Call opposing counsel prior to mediation to discuss the claim. This is vital to ensuring you and your adversary are at not so far apart in valuing the claims that mediation will be unproductive. This does not mean that you have to engage in substantive negotiations prior to mediation (though an initial demand and offer are usually helpful to get the ball rolling towards settlement), but you can anger a client by wasting a day in a mediation that does not move the case towards settlement when a simple phone call to the other side could have told you the time is not right for mediation. If there are multiple defendants being represented by separate counsel, it is worthwhile for defense counsel to discuss amongst themselves prior to mediation if they can come to an agreement (informal or otherwise) as to how to apportion liability for the purpose of making global settlement offers and responding to demands at mediation.

You will need to make sure you have the right representative attending the mediation for the party you represent. As a plaintiff's attorney representing an individual, you typically just need to bring your client with you. As a defense attorney, you need to make sure the right person (or people) with decision-making authority attend mediation. This would usually mean a high-ranking corporate officer for a self-insured defendant or an adjuster for an insurance carrier for the client. If there is an excess insurance policy and the potential for the value of the case is likely to be above the primary insurance policy, it is a good idea to have the excess insurance adjuster present for the mediation as well. Some mediators will permit you to have the person with decision-making authority available by phone without participating directly in the mediation. However, mediations are generally more successful where the mediator can speak to the decision-makers and explain their opinions on the value of the case directly. Although Zoom mediations have become more commonplace, in-person mediation with all decision-makers present tend to be the most effective in getting all parties to compromise to the point where mediation is successful.

Every litigation is different, but if you take the time to make sure you are fully prepared for private mediation, your mediation is more likely to result in a settlement.







